| <b>Purpose of the course</b> | <p>This <b>new qualification</b> is designed to support learners who are interested in learning about the business environment of the travel and tourism industry. It is equal to 1 full A level. The general emphasis is less on examination and more on exploration and project work.</p> <p>Learning is enhanced by trips, guest speakers from the travel industry and by allowing students the opportunity to conduct work experience.</p> <p><b>Trips and experiences</b> are a core part of the course. Learning trips to Disney Land Paris, a UK seaside resort, and UK tourist hotspots are all planned. A work experience activity will also be available.</p>  |                           |            |

| <b>Assessment method</b>     | 50% coursework and 50% examination (examination topics are pre notified)   |                           |            |
| <b>Further studies</b>       | <p>The qualification carries UCAS points (see page 94 of spec) and is recognised by higher education providers (see stakeholder recognition tab on the exam board website linked below) as contributing to admission requirements to many travel and tourism courses. It can give context to subjects that would benefit from some sector background and be taken as part of a diverse programme, leaving progression options fully open. When combined with other qualifications within a two-year study programme, such as AS/A Levels or another BTEC National, you can progress to higher education degree programmes at college or university.
