Course contents	Learners will be assessed on either acting or design.		
	Learners participate in the creation, development and performance of a piece of		
	theatre based on a reinterpretation of an extract from a text chosen from a list		
	supplied by Eduqas. The piece must be developed using the techniques and		
	working methods of either an influential theatre practitioner or a recognised		
	theatre company.		
	Component 2: Text in Action		
	Learners will be assessed on either acting or design.		
	Learners participate in the creation, development and performance of two pieces of		
	theatre based on a stimulus supplied by the exam board.		
	Component 3: Text in Performance		
	Open book:		
	Two questions, based on two different texts, one written pre-1956 and one written		
	post-1956.		
	Pre-1956: Hedda Gabler by Henrik Ibsen		
	Post-1956: Accidental Death of An Anarchist by Dario Fo		
	Closed book:		
	A series of questions based on a specified extract from The Curious Incident of the		
	Dog in the Night-Time by Mark Haddon, adapted by Simon Stephens		
Assessment method	Three components.		
	Component 1: Theatre Workshop (Internally assessed and externally moderated)		
	Learners will be assessed on either acting or design.		
	Learners must produce:		
	a realisation of the performance or design a creative log		
	a creative log Component 3: Tout in Action (Externally assessed)		
	Component 2: Text in Action (Externally assessed) Learners must realise their performances live for the visiting examiner. Learners		
	choosing design must also give a 5-10 minute presentation of their design to the		
	examiner.		
	Component 3: Text in Performance (written examination)		
Further studies	As well as Theatre-related studies post-18 such as Performing Arts, Acting, Theatre		
Fultilei studies	Design and Musical Theatre; the course promotes the independent thought		
	required to achieve well in any subject at higher education. The theoretical aspects
