Course contents	Students will study the following eleven topics in the course: <ul style="list-style-type: none">Paper 1 – Introductory topics in Psychology<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Social Influence● Memory● Attachment● PsychopathologyPaper 2 - Psychology in Context<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Approaches in Psychology● Biopsychology● Research MethodsPaper 3 - Issues and Options in Psychology<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Issues and Debates in Psychology● Cognition development● Schizophrenia● Aggression		
Assessment method	Three externally assessed exam papers. Each Assessment is 2 hours consisting of 96 marks. <ul style="list-style-type: none">● The papers may include multiple-choice, short open, open-response, calculations and extended writing questions.● The papers will include questions that target mathematics at Level 2 or above and a minimum of 10% of the marks across the three papers will be awarded for mathematics at Level 2 or above. At least 25 – 30% of the overall assessment will assess skills, knowledge and understanding in relation to research methods.
